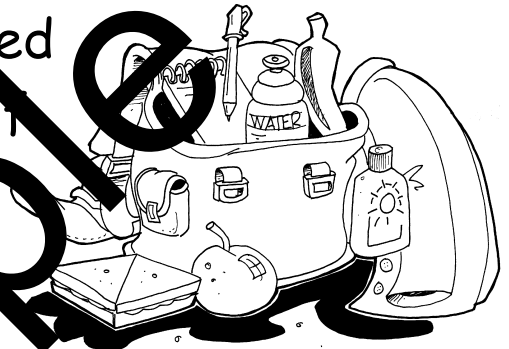


# Big Day Out 2

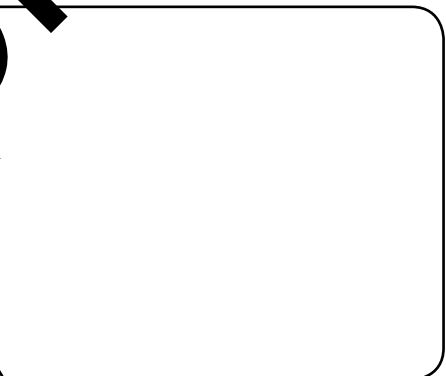

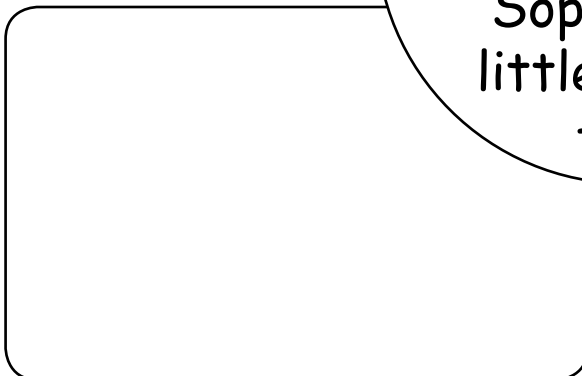

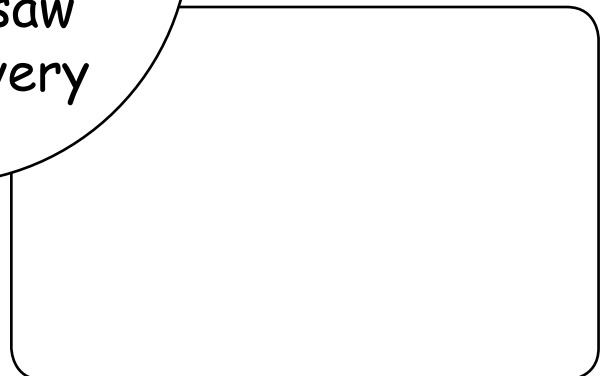
